LDISS is a new service.


We help people with a learning disability and challenging behaviour.

Who LDISS help





Some people go to a special hospital for challenging behaviour.

The team helps people move out of a special hospital.



The team will help people who are not coping in the community.

The LDISS team is small.

The team can only help a few people at a time.

What the LDISS team does



The team will work with your family and carers.

The team can advise them on different ways to help.



The team can help you at home for an agreed time.



If the team is helping you, you can phone us for advice.





The team works with other Learning Disability services.

The team works with schools and Commissioners (people who pay for the service).





The team works with other people who help you.
