- 1. Does your Trust use pen and paper to build patient records? If so, in which departments? The primary form of health record in all services is an EPR (electronic patient record). In some services, especially inpatients, a number of documents are in paper format for completion by pen and are scanned and uploaded to the EPR on completion.
- 2. Does your Trust use analogue tape dictation to record patient encounters? If so, in which departments?

We are unaware of the use of analogue tape dictation to record patient encounters.

3. Who in the Trust is responsible for digitising paper records? We do not digitalise paper records created before our EPR. Any paper documents created or received are scanned and uploaded to the EPR by ward/department staff.
